Learning Intentions

Students describe changes to objects, materials and living things.

Students pose and respond to questions about their experiences and predict outcomes of investigations. They use informal measurements to make and compare observations. They record and represent observations and communicate ideas in a variety of ways.

Daradgee Specific Elaborations

This experience may require students to:

- recognise that farm animals have predictable characteristics at different stages of their life cycles
- explore different characteristics of life stages in animals eg. egg, chick, and adult
- observe that all animals have offspring, usually with two parents
- recognise that chicks must have a warm, safe shelter to survive
- identify the ways humans manage and protect resources eg. reducing and recycling waste
- discuss with others what was discovered in the farm
- represent observations through digital photography
