#### **Alison Lester**

Popular children's writer and illustrator, Alison Lester is the inaugural Australia Children's Laureate, an honour she's sharing with Boori Monty Pryor for 2012/13. A multi-awarded writer and illustrator, Alison Lester has published over 30 books including beloved picture books such as *Magic Beach, Imagine* and *My Farm*. More recently she has been writing novels, including *The Quicksand Pony* and the Bonnie and Sam series illustrated by Roland Harvey.

The classic *Are we there yet?* published in 2004 has been chosen to help promote this years' National Year of Reading, selling more than 150,000 copies to date. It was inspired by an actual journey undertaken by Alison, her husband and their three young children around Australia



in a campervan. Every parent who has done a road trip with children will be familiar with the often repeated title of the book coming from the back seat!

Fittingly, Alison is an ambassador for the National Year of Reading.

Alison's rural background and love of nature is evident in her book subjects, and her rich, detailed illustrations allow pre-readers to "get" the storyline. Alison Lester spent her childhood on a farm in South Gippsland then trained as an art teacher. A stint at Victoria's Distance Education decorating student work sheets followed by the

birth of her first child and a desire to work from home saw Alison telephone a publisher to ask for an illustration job. After five years of illustrating other people's books (and critiquing their authorship) she had a go at her own book with *Clive Eats Alligators*, which kicked off her 21-year career.


#### **Elizabeth Honey**

She is the award-winning author of many junior novels such as 45 & 47 Stella Street and Remote Man, as well as picture books and poetry. Elizabeth Honey's books are published in the USA, Italy and Germany. Her playful humour, originality and energy strike a chord with kids all over the world. Her most recent book, *To the Boy in Berlin*, was written in collaboration with her German translator, Heike Brandt.



Welcome to the 2012 Writers' & Illustrators' Camp.


Our Theme is 'Make us laugh' and you will explore how humour is used in so many ways to get messages across.
